Amendment 1 changes the state's term limits law. While term limits would still be in place, they would be extended from 6 years to 12 years for state representatives, and from 8 years to 12 years for state senators.	27%	66%	6%

#### **Methodology and Sample Information**

Between October 5th and October 20th, the Survey Research Center at the University of Arkansas dialed 4,789 randomly selected Arkansas telephone numbers. These attempts yielded 758 completed surveys<sup>3</sup>. The remainder of the surveys were not completed for a variety of reasons, including the resident's absence, a refusal to participate, a busy or disconnected line, or the resident's ineligibility. Employing guidelines established by the American Association for Public Opinion Research, the poll's cooperation rate was 44%. This figure reflects completed surveys as a percentage of all eligible individuals contacted. The survey's margin of error is +/- 3 percentage points.

To assess the representativeness of the sample drawn for the poll, the Arkansas Poll team opts to publish what most polling organizations do not: a comparison of survey respondents' key demographic characteristics to those of the state as a whole. This information is reported in the table below.
