#### **Methodology and Sample Information**

Between October 8th and October 17th, the Survey Research Center at the University of Arkansas dialed 6,808 randomly selected Arkansas telephone numbers. These attempts yielded 766 completed surveys<sup>3</sup>. The remainder of the surveys were not completed for a variety of reasons, including the resident's absence, a refusal to participate, a busy or disconnected line, or the resident's ineligibility. Employing guidelines established by the American Association for Public Opinion Research, the poll's cooperation rate was 37%. This figure reflects completed surveys as a percentage of all eligible individuals contacted. The survey's margin of error is +/- 3 percentage points.

To assess the representativeness of the sample drawn for the poll, the Arkansas Poll team opts to publish what most polling organizations do not: a comparison of survey respondents' key demographic characteristics to those of the state as a whole. This information is reported in the table below.
