## Methodology and Sample Information

Between October $14^{\text {th }}$ and October $19^{\text {th }}$ Eastern Research Services completed 800 telephone surveys among a random sample of adult Arkansans. ${ }^{7}$ Twenty percent of all respondents spoke with SRC interviewers via cell phone.
The survey's margin of error statewide is $+/-3.5$ percentage points, meaning that we are 95 percent confident that the actual result lies within 3.5 percentage points (in either direction) of the result our sample produced. The margin of error for the 599 self-identified "very likely voters" is +/- 4 percentage points.
Employing guidelines established by the American Association for Public Opinion Research, the poll's overall cooperation rate was $39 \%$ ( $52 \%$ for landline calls and $20 \%$ for cell phone calls). This figure reflects completed surveys as a percentage of all eligible individuals contacted.
To assess the representativeness of the sample drawn for the poll, the Arkansas Poll team publishes what most polling organizations do not: a comparison of survey respondents' key demographic characteristics to those of the state as a whole. This information is reported in the table below.
